Christmas and Lottie

At Christmas time, I'd like to take the opportunity to thank and affirm those pastors, leaders, and servants among us who are working to set goals for and give toward our yearly missions offering, the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering.

First, I'd like to assure you that your giving does amazing things to keep a long-term presence in often difficult and precarious situations. The need for a long-term presence in areas where lostness is overwhelming cannot be understated. Short term missions have an important place in mission strategy. Giving and prayer cannot be dispensed. The presence of long-term missionaries, however, in parts of the world where 87% of the population of Buddhists, Hindus, and Muslims have **not even one Christian friend**,* is invaluable.

Short term workers have great value, in sharing their skills, love, and lives with those around


them. To make real disciples however, according to the command of Jesus, it is exponentially more effective to have a committed disciple of Christ live out an incarnational witness among the people group where he or she has been called, for a committed length of time, if possible. He needs to at least attempt to learn the language, study the culture, and become a student of the ones he loves and wants to serve. He can then learn the true patterns of culture and understand what a genuine heart that seeks to be a real disciple in that culture looks like. As he grows in love and understanding of his host culture, and they grow in love and respect for him, those around him help him to see where God is working. He (or she) is then able to invest where God is working, to train real disciples, and share resources in ways that help, not hurt. To build this kind of trust and these kind of relationships takes time. The best short-term workers learn from these long-term servants, and as they work together, their work has better chances of going deeper, further, and wider.

And this support of the long-term worker as part of the strategy of evangelism and church planting is at the heart of the LMCO. The LMCO puts our missionaries where they need to be and supports them so they can remain there. It takes an average of two years to lay the foundation of proper language study. The LMCO helps missionaries learn the language and continue to grow in language beyond two years. Missionaries often face unique challenges in their areas of service, including lack of access to reliable medical care, educational needs for children, and upheavals that no one can predict. The LMCO resources help missionaries through these challenges. Also, importantly, the LMCO provides these resources so that these workers can share the gospel message, and one of the most beautiful messages of Christmas, that He has come—Emmanuel, God with us; He came.

And this message is what Lottie Moon told those she served in China, and her urgency to share it comes to us in her letters. She called men and women (ladies, please read in her letter how urgent her call to women is, and how important your voice is among the women of the world!). And because what she said is true, still we pray, still we send, and still, thank God, He calls some among us to go.
